Supporting your child at home with...Reading!

Research shows that the most important thing you can do to help your child achieve at school is read with them. Little and often is the key!

There are three things that your child needs to learn to do:

- 1) Decode words
- 2) Understand what they have read
- 3) Enjoy it!

Reading with your child should be enjoyable. The more fun you have, the more likely you are to instil a love of reading. Encourage discussion with your child when reading with them.
