Helping children to speak out

The signs that a child is being harmed aren't always obvious, and a child might not tell anyone what's happening to them. Children might be scared that the abuser will find out, and worried that the abuse will get worse. Or they might think that there's no-one they can tell or that they won't be believed. Sometimes, children don't even realise that what's happening is abuse. We do a lot at school to encourage children to find ways to tell someone they trust. One of the ways children can get help outside of school is to ring Childline, which we promote around school. **0800 1111**

Supporting your Child at Home...Tips for good homework habits:

- Do find a quiet place at home to use as a homework area. It needs a flat surface, a good light source and the right equipment eg pens, pencils, ruler, scissors, glue.
- Do plan; and agree on, a time when your child will do their homework.
- Do allow your child to have something nutritional to eat before starting on homework.
- Do turn off the TV - but you could have music on if they find it helpful.
- Don't give your child the answer in order to get a task finished. Instead, explain how to look up information or find a word in a dictionary.
- Don't teach your child methods you used at school. It could confuse them. Ask the class teacher about modern methods.
- Don't let homework become a chore. Keep it fun and make it a special time that you both look forward to
